The result, then, is that a Danish "Nordic Manager" might focus especially on Denmark customers, just as a Finn would focus on Finland first, a Swede on Sweden, etc. But because ART recruits in all Nordic countries, their recruiters know to prioritize candidates for pan-Nordic roles whose work history and attitudes suggest a strong likelihood to reach out beyond their own linguistic and national markets. ART feels that its role is not just to fill a vacancy, but to fill it with someone who can fulfill the client's long-term business mission well.
